LANGBOURN WARD CLUB 125th ANNIVERSARY TUESDAY 21^{ST} April 2015 at 5.30 p.m. for 5.45 p.m.

I am delighted to advise you that in this the 125^{th} Anniversary year of the inauguration of the Langbourn Ward Club, an evening reception has been organised to celebrate the event at the Pewterers' Hall – the place identified within the archive records as:

"The inaugural meeting of the Club took place in The London Tavern, 53 & 54 Fenchurch Street and they continued to hold meetings there on a further 96 occasions between 1890 and 1922. When The London Tavern was pulled down for redevelopment the Club moved to the Pewterers' Hall, which was then at 15 Lime Street."

I am also very happy to inform you that the **Rt. Hon. the Lord Mayor, Alderman Alan Yarrow,** has kindly accepted our invitation to join us with his Civic Team to witness an evening encompassing historical anecdotes from our Alderman Sir David Wootton and the LWC Chairman, Deputy John D Chapman - The passages being extracts from the newly published "History of Langbourn Ward Club" by 'Dicky' Bird.

Musical entertainment will be provided by the **GSMD** presenting a selection of Jazz and topical songs from the 1920's and '30's era. Sparkling wine and canapés will be served throughout the evening allowing guests to relax and enjoy the ambience of the Pewterers Hall in an atmosphere of reflection on the Ward Clubs' colourful history

Finally, in order to retain the topical theme for the evening (and unfortunately the maximum capacity of the Hall) we have had to limit the number of tickets available to 125 with a fixed price of £25 which will only be available to Members and their partners in the first instance. Should the event be oversubscribed tickets will be issued on a 'first come first served basis'.
